Ball Games at District, Regional and National Levels

At the National Level, Aringa Secondary School was one of the teams that represented West Nile Region. Although the competition brought together the country's best schools and was highly competitive, our learners displayed exceptional discipline, determination, resilience, and sporting talent. Their participation enhanced the school's visibility and reputation while providing invaluable exposure to national-level competition where the team was ranked to the 51st position.



S.4 and S.6 Parents' Class Meeting:

The S.4/ and S.6 class meeting with parents was held to discuss the academic progress, discipline, lesson attendance, and preparation of candidates for the Uganda Certificate of Education (UCE) and Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education (UACE) Examinations. 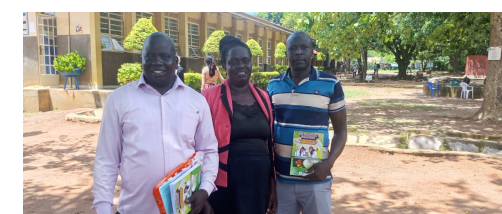
West Nile Muslim Students' Leadership Training

The School Perimeter Fence Construction Project
